





2024-25 Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) Assessment Data Summary Collected from 118 teachers: representing 93% of the total participating teachers

Net Promoter (NPS) How likely are you to recommend VTS to a friend or colleague?



"Students are encouraged to be creative, write independently, and use evidence. These strategies have a positive impact on their foundational writing skills."


"VTS provides students with opportunities to practice their critical thinking skills, writing skills, and another chance to speak up and share their thoughts in a comfortable environment."


"Students take their observations and then elaborate on them by finding evidence to prove their observations. This transfers to other content areas where it is important to then prove their thoughts.

"I have seen an increase in some of my students who never volunteer, start to share as the VTS sessions went on."



An example of an unsupported inference, "I think it's fall."


An example of a supported inference, "I think it's fall because the leaves have turned red."


The graph shows what we hope to occur during the year. The goal is that as the number of unsupported inferences decreases, the number of supported inferences increases.
