

## 2024 Combined Wabash County Elementary & Middle School Show and Wabash County & Peru High School Show

By combining our annual Elementary, Middle School and High School shows, all Wabash County students are eligible to participate in the spring street banner competition. This year's joint gallery show will hang in the Clark Gallery at the Honeywell Center from April 10 – May 12.

Below are the guidelines for the annual all-county open show.

## **Delivery Dates:**

- Wednesday, March 27, by 5 pm or before. Bring to the Honeywell Center Box Office.
- Banner competition and best of show judging will take place on **Thursday**, March 28.
- The Honeywell Center will hang the artwork beginning April 9.

## Awards:

- Every student whose artwork is submitted for the show will receive a finalist ribbon. The awards will be presented at the reception on Monday, May 6 at 7 pm in the Honeywell Center Ford Theater.
- 24-28 Wabash County pieces will be selected to be made into Spring Street Banners, which will hang on light poles around the Honeywell Center until November. Please note that the dimensions of the artwork submitted will play a key role in those selected as banner winners. A landscape design will not always crop nicely to fit the dimensions of our banners.
- Student artwork selected by our judge that cannot be made into a banner due to size or proportion, will receive a Best of Gallery Show Rosette.


Pick-up Dates: Any day Mon-Fri after May 13 from 8 am-5 pm. Pick-up at the Box Office.

## **Guidelines**:

- The show is open to all Wabash County school students in public schools, private schools and home school settings. Peru High School students will be part of the high school portion of the show.
- Each school may enter up to **20 pieces**. Of those 20 pieces, 5 **pieces** can be non-wall hung/3-D artworks because we have limited space in display cases.
- All media are allowed.

- We will be able to accept digital work in movie form (stop motion animation, animated drawings, flipbooks, etc...) These will be submitted on a flash drive with your other artwork and should be a .mov file. The flash drive will be returned with the artwork at the conclusion of the gallery show. Each school may submit 5 digital files in addition to the 20 pieces of artwork. Please be sure to include these as entries on the Google form that you complete as well with the indication that this is a digital file in the description of artwork. We will combine all .mov submissions into one file that will continually loop on a TV in the gallery. Even though these submissions will not be judged as a potential spring banner, we are excited to be able to display digital art.
- Art teachers should complete the Google form in the link below for each student entry. An invitation to the reception will be sent to each student's home. Please be sure student names are spelled correctly and the students' grade level is correct.

- The Honeywell Center is not responsible for damage to artwork due to hanging device failure.
- High School artwork may be framed or just matted.
- If a binder clip will not be sufficient to hang the artwork, <u>a hanger must be attached</u> to the back of the artwork for hanging.
- Collaborative pieces by more than one artist may be submitted.
- There is no size limit, but the entry must be able to be displayed within the capabilities of the Clark Gallery.

**Label:** Place in bottom right corner of mat or hanging from the lower corner. For consistency, use the font "Arial" size 24. See below:



Don't forget to label your delivery boxes/portfolios. We want to make sure your artwork is available for pick up in the same manner it was delivered.
